Early Wednesday Morning Through Wednesday Evening

January 29, 2019

NWS, Wilmington:

WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY REMAINS IN EFFECT UNTIL 10 AM EST THIS MORNING...

...WIND CHILL WARNING IN EFFECT FROM 4 AM TO 7 PM EST WEDNESDAY...

...WIND CHILL ADVISORY IN EFFECT FROM 7 PM WEDNESDAY TO 1 PM EST THURSDAY...

* WHAT...Black ice continuing. Dangerously cold wind chills as low as 30 below zero expected.

* WHERE...In Indiana, Dearborn County. In Ohio, Butler, Warren, Clinton and Hamilton Counties.

* WHEN...For the Wind Chill Warning, from 4 AM to 7 PM EST Wednesday. For the Winter Weather Advisory, until 10 AM EST this morning. For the Wind Chill Advisory, from 7 PM Wednesday to 1 PM EST Thursday.

* ADDITIONAL DETAILS...Plan on slippery road conditions. The hazardous conditions could impact the morning or evening commute. The cold wind chills could cause frostbite on exposed skin in as little as 30 minutes.

South of the I-70 corridor, wind chills Wednesday and Wednesday night will drop to 10 to 25 below zero.

Dangerous Wind Chills
Starting Tonight Through Thursday

A second and stronger push of arctic air will arrive tonight, with temperatures going below zero in parts of area by daybreak Wednesday.

Dangerous wind chills ranging from -25°F to -35°F are expected along/north of I-71 and I-70, with the coldest wind chills Wednesday morning and early afternoon.

Do NOT venture outdoors for any length of time late today through Thursday without proper cold-weather attire!

Weather DTN: Outside of a brief shot at some light snow showers from 8pm tonight through 4am tomorrow it does not look like much more than 1/2" at the most during that period and could well be less or just trace-type activity. It will be windy and cold with temps falling into the single digits for most of the daylight hours, hovering in the lower single digits with winds westerly 13-23mph, so windchill in the -15F to -19F range during the day.
